The Middle Tennessee **E**mergency Amateur Repeater System is a UHF interconnected radio repeater system with statewide coverage. **MTEARS** also serves as a delivery method for severe weather alerts, weekly drills, and other activities for the state, and serves as an alternate support for active operational areas. Although **MTEARS** may appear to be much like other interconnected systems, the interoperability linking of various sites via MESH technologies sets it apart.

The Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA), National Weather Service (NWS) Field Offices, and all levels of Emergency Planners rely on **MTEARS** and on your participation during emergencies.

There is no cost to join **MTEARS**!

The system is available for use by ALL federally licensed  
Amateur Radio Operators.

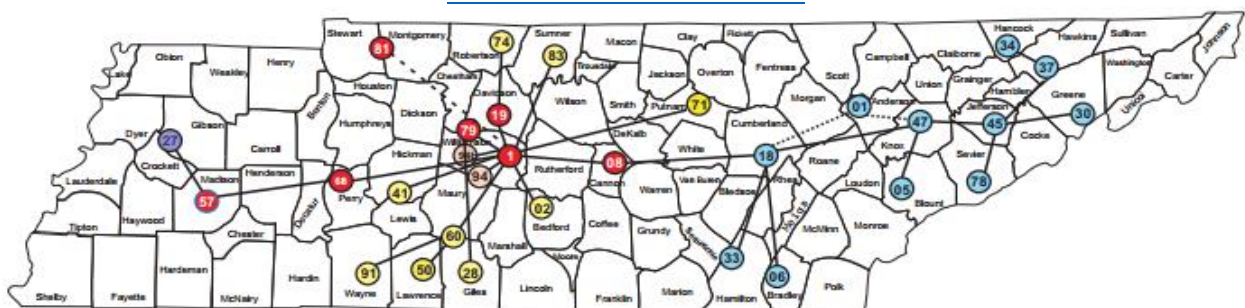
